MCC Town Hall

On April 26th the McGill Community Council held its first joint town hall. The McGill Communities Council (MCC), a committee of unions and associations representing thousands of employees (academic, managerial, unionised) and students (graduate and undergraduate) at McGill convened a hybrid Town Hall of all the memberships to discuss challenges faced and lessons learned from the Covid-19 pandemic. The meeting focused on how the pandemic affected the McGill community, specifically union and association concerns, and the path forward as a university community. Three key areas for future action and cooperation were identified: pedagogy, governance, and health & safety. However, one thing we learned was that we had many issues in common.

As the McGill community emerges from the Covid-19 pandemic, MCC wants to move forward together in addressing health & safety, pedagogical, and governance issues in the University. Three areas identified by the Council are creating long-term thinking on the future of pedagogy in the University, adapting to the new reality of hybrid learning & work and how it can be adapted to the traditional in-person curriculum, and including faculty experts in the decision making process of the administration.



Lifting of mask mandates

As we know, masks are not obligatory at McGill as of May 24th (with the exception of the faculty of Medicine), in addition to the Quebec government lifting its mask mandate the week prior. As we head back to campus 100% next week, MUNACA encourages all members to be patient with these transitions, each member's situation is unique, and each of us will have to make those decisions for our specific needs, whether to keep wearing masks or not after this time.

We will have to be understanding with our fellow co workers regardless of whether or not we choose to wear masks. We will get through this post pandemic reality, so let's try to be respectful of everyone's choices.


